



Bel Echo blanc | Marlborough (NZ) Sauvignon 2019

Domain

Bel Echo

Clos Henri is the domain of the Bourgeois family in Marlborough (New Zealand). Since many years they are respected winegrowers in the Loire region, and wanted to expand. Unfortunately, there were too few options for this. That is why in 2000 they decided to purchase 98 hectares of farmland in the Wairau Valley (New Zealand) and started the first plantations carefully. The first wines were produced in 2003. Marlborough is the best known and most important wine region in New Zealand. It is located on the northernmost summit of the southern island, has a dry and sunny climate and accounts for 75% of New Zealand's production.

Vinification

Cold premaceration, followed by a fermentation between 12-14 $^{\circ}$ C. The wine ages in stainless steel tanks for a minimum period of 6 months.

Taste

In the nose the very intensive aroma of passion fruit and exotic flowers. In the mouth a wide pallet, a little passion fruit, ripe pineapple and a hint of grapefruit. A balanced wine with a subtle minerality and intense experiences.
